If earning extra income is your goal, research if your niche supports it. Look at other blogs: Are there ads, affiliate links, or products for sale?

Step 2: Choosing a Domain Name

Think of your domain as your blog's home address.

- Avoid hyphens or complex spellings
- Check that social media handles are available

Example:

A travel blog for budget adventures could be "BudgetTrailBlazer.com".

Step 3: Web Hosting Basics

Your host stores your blog and makes it accessible online. Good hosting equals a fast, secure, and reliable site.

- SiteGround
- HostGator

Look for easy "one-click" WordPress installs, good reviews, and responsive support.

Pitfalls to Avoid When Setting Up

- **Domain mistakes**—Avoid domains that are too close to competitors or trademarks.
- **Not enabling backups/security**—Set up backups from day one to avoid data loss.

Easy SEO for Beginners

Starter Tips:

- Include your main phrase or topic naturally in the first paragraphs.
- Add alt text to images (descriptive file names—see the examples used in this book).
- Link internally to other helpful posts on your blog.

Social Media Basics

Monetizing isn't required—but if earning is your goal, even beginners have options.

Ads

Display Ads:

Start with networks like Google AdSense once you have some initial traffic. Ads pay per view and per click. With more traffic, networks like Mediavine offer higher returns.

Pros:

- Set and forget
- Simple to add

Cons:

- Require decent traffic for real payoff
- Can distract from your content

Affiliate Marketing

Promote products or services you trust using special links. When a reader clicks and buys, you earn a commission.

Join programs like Amazon Associates, ShareASale, or niche-specific networks.

Pros:

- No need to create your own products
- Works even for new blogs

Cons:

- Requires transparent disclaimers
- Choose only products relevant to your audience for trust

Selling Digital Products

E-books, printables, online courses, or templates can turn your blog into a business.

Create "starter kits," planners, guides unique to your niche.

Pros:

- Unlimited earning potential
- Full creative control

Cons:

- Requires upfront effort to create
- Customer support needed

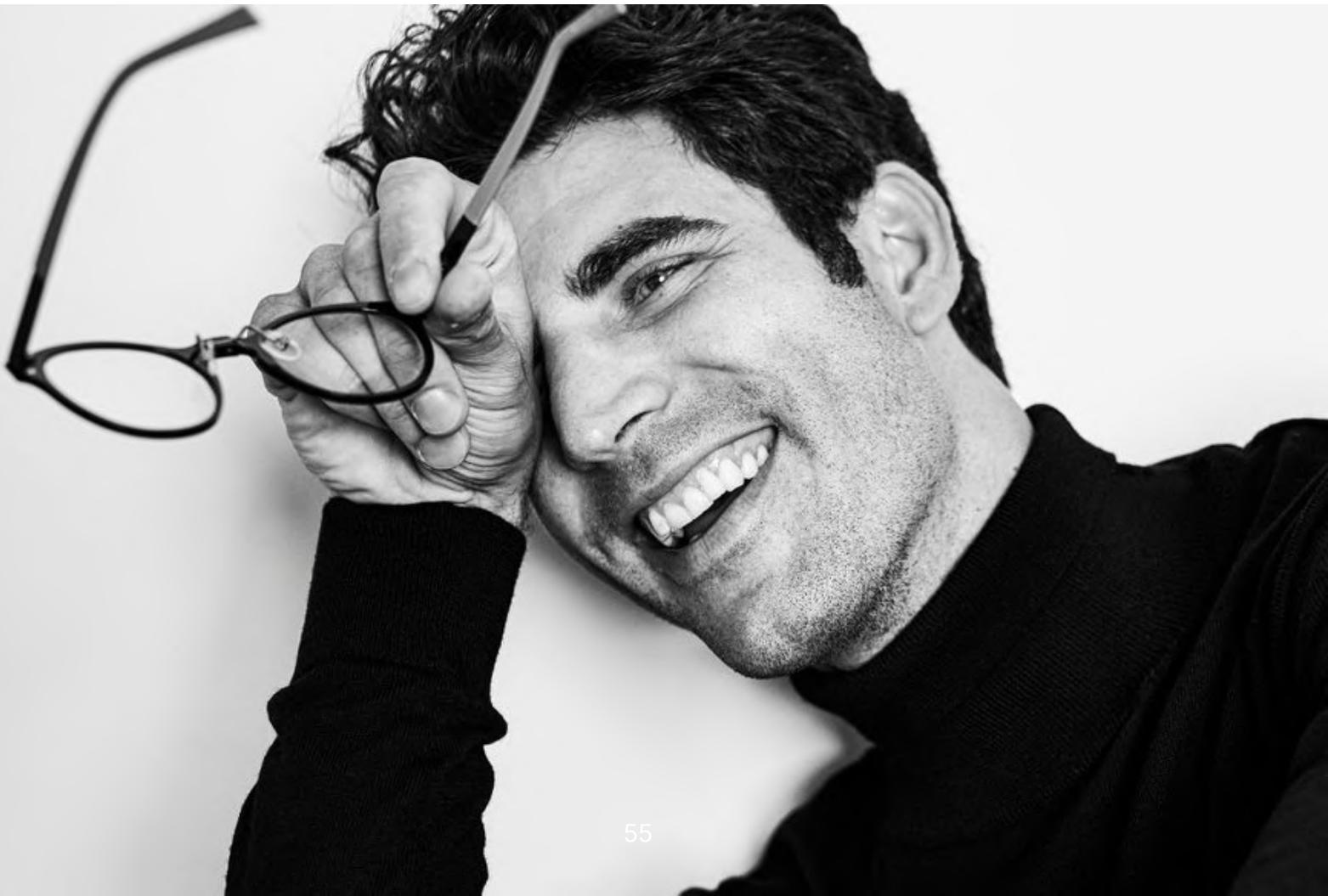
